

Dance Plus Covid Policies & Procedures

Please take a minute to read through these guidelines to familiarize yourself and your dancers with our covid procedures.

- Registration is required for class. Registration takes place online only.
- If you or a family member are sick, alert the studio and stay home.
- The studio is closed to parents and observers. Students arrive and go directly to class.
- The studio is open for students, faculty, and staff.
- Social distancing measures need to be adhered to the fullest extent possible.
- Mask are required again as of July 26, 2021.
- Dancers must bring their own water bottles.
- Bring bare necessities with you for class
- Dancers are required to sanitize upon entering the building.

Students and staff must be free of a fever (temp not over 100.4) and any COVID-19 symptoms. According to the CDC, people with COVID-19 have a wide range of symptoms. Common symptoms are:

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Difficulty breathing
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Recent loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting

WHAT IF A DANCER OR STAFF MEMBER TEST POSITIVE FOR COVID-19?

Everyone is required to inform DP management if a student, staff member, faculty, or a household member has tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected of being COVID-19 positive. The studio will close for 2-5 days and seek guidance from local health authorities. The studio will be immediately disinfected. We will notify all members of possible exposure, keeping the identity of the individual confidential, and contact our local health department. If a student/staff member tests positive or is suspected of testing positive for COVID-19 they will be required to quarantine as guided by local health authorities.

As recommended by the CDC Dance Plus will conduct the following:

Have an established infectious Disease Outbreak Plan.

Asses if community members (students, faculty, staff) are at higher risk and plan accordingly.

Review absenteeism patterns among our students and staff, contacting local health officials to alert them of large increases of absenteeism due to COVID-19

Government Mandated Shelter-in-Place order procedure
